Practical Principles

3. God's worst is better than the world's best. God offers us purpose, meaning in life, the joy of the Lord, and the guaranteed hope that we'll go to Heaven when we die.
4. We should fail forward. If you make a mistake or do something wrong and own it and learn from it, then that's a lesson well learned. That's what failing forward means.

Relevant Reminders

- Moses spent 40 years finding out he was a somebody, 40 years finding out he was a

nobody, and then 40 years finding out what God can do with a somebody who realizes they're a nobody.

- Maybe you're young and you have a sense that God wants to do something with your life. The Lord has something special in store for you. Pray about it and pursue it in God's timing.
- The temptations in your life are no different than what others are experiencing.

Applicable Actions

We all fail in life. We all have lapses. We've all done something that we're ashamed of. We've done things we know we shouldn't have done. Well, God gives second chances. You can say to Him, "Lord, I blew it. I'm sorry." Ask Him for forgiveness and He will give it.
